Before Volunteering

Construction volunteers must be 18 years of age and are required to complete a liability waiver for each Habitat for Humanity project they support. If possible, we ask the liability waiver be completed prior to volunteering and brought to the construction site.

Construction Site Location and Hours

Individual volunteers have the opportunity to work at the construction site Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. For those interested in coordinating a group volunteer experience, contact Habitat for Humanity by phone at 307-234-1348 or by email at tangelo@heartofwyoming.org.

What to Bring and Wear

We recommend you bring a water bottle, sunscreen, a hat and work gloves in preparing to volunteer. Dress for the weather and be prepared to spend time outside. Additionally, Habitat for Humanity has a dress code for the construction site to ensure your safety, which includes:

- Closed-toed and heel, sturdy shoes.
- No loose jewelry or clothing.
- When necessary, personal protective equipment.
- · Shorts can be worn, but must be of modest length.
- Apparel that is appropriate for weather conditions. Jeans are acceptable.
- Any clothing with disturbing messages or that could be considered provocative, which others could view as
 offensive or suggestive, is prohibited.

No Experience Required

Habitat for Humanity, The Heart of Wyoming believes everyone can have an impact on the construction site, with no experience required. Construction Manager Shawn Martz is the primary point of contact on the construction site. Upon arriving at the site, volunteers are required to check-in with Shawn, who will provide guidance and needed equipment. As a licensed contractor with many years of experience, Shawn oversees the construction site and all construction volunteers.

For Your Safety

Safety for our volunteers on the construction site is a priority. We recommend that volunteers take a free, 15-minute online volunteer safety training course.
